Students Go Hungry to Feed Others

Cumberland County, Pa. (April 15, 2008) – 30 Middle School and High School students from Carlisle Christian Academy go without food for 30 hours to raise money for World Vision's 30 Hour Famine. 30 Hour Famine is an international youth movement to fight hunger.

This is Carlisle Christian Academy's 8th year being a part of the 30 Hour Famine. This year while the students were fasting, they were involved in community service projects. Some students helped with different projects at Bethel Assembly of God, several helped at the daycare also located at Bethel Assembly of God, others helped at a local kennel and the other students helped at the school.

"The students were amazing! They worked with no complaints or arguing, even while being hungry. The only comments I heard from the students were, "What else can I do?" said Maggie Lattin, Director of Student Development.

This year the students raised \$4375.00! This is the highest amount we have raised in a single year. Over the past eight years, Carlisle Christian Academy has raised a total of \$22,874.53 through the 30 Hour Famine for World Vision.
