



Extracurricular Opportunities **for Home School Students**

Sports

- **Soccer (5-12)**
Soccer is a co-ed for grades 6-12. This year we will not be having a team, but will instead be having an intramural where skills and techniques will be learned and practiced.
- **Volleyball (6-12)**
Volleyball is a girls' team. The volleyball season runs from August through October. Students must attend all practices and games. An Athletic Contract must be signed and honored. (additional fees will apply)

Middle School Boys' and Girls' and High School Boys' and Girls' teams are available. Basketball season runs from November through February. Students must attend all practices and games. An Athletic Contract must be signed and honored. (additional fees will apply)

□ **Chess Club: (Grades K-12)**
